Block Watch

BLOCK WATCH

Block Watch is a free program in partnership with the New Westminster Police. The goal

of the Block Watch Program is building safer communities. Our aim is to help residents organize their neighbourhoods by encouraging neighbours to work together in order to prevent crime in their neighbourhood. It is believed that neighbours working together are the first, and best line of defence against crime. Participants watch out for their neighbour's property and report suspicious activities to the Police. Block Watch is one of the most comprehensive and successful home security and community safety programs and crime will be reduced.

Crime Free Multi-Housing

The Crime Free Multi-Housing program (CFMH) is designed to help owners, managers, and residents

of multi-unit rental properties, in cooperation with the police and other agencies, to eradicate illegal and nuisance activity from their property. The program consists of three phases involving workshops, a security assessment, and an annual Resident Safety Meeting. Once all three phases are completed the management earn the opportunity to use CFMH Program signs and logos. The result of this program is a safer, more habitable living environment, coupled with often lower maintenance and repair costs, and a more desirable building which can lead to increased property value.

Citizens' Crime Watch Patrol



Citizens' Crime Watch Patrol (CCWP) is a long standing community crime prevention initiative that was

launched in March 1983. Volunteers work closely with the New Westminster Police and act as their eyes and ears, by patrolling streets, parks and other public areas in vehicles and reporting suspicious, criminal, and nuisance behaviour. The success of this program relies heavily on the dedication and skill demonstrated by the volunteers. This is one of New Westminster's most influential programs for volunteers, as information given to the Police through CCWP volunteers has led to some notable arrests.



Speed and Traffic Watch

30 Speed and Traffic Watch volunteers are directed by the New Westminster Police to monitor motorists' behaviours within our city limits. Volunteers observe traffic conditions, volumes and offences that are committed in our neighbourhoods. Using RADAR equipment volunteers can monitor motorists' speeds and make drivers aware of their speed through the use of electronic signs with instant feedback. Alongside this, statistics gathered by the volunteers influence traffic enforcement within New Westminster. This program encourages drivers to act more responsibly and directly benefits drivers, residents and the police, particularly in areas where the risk for crashes may be greater.

Prevention POWERED BY VOLUNTEER

Volunteer Bicycle Patrol

The Volunteer Bicycle Patrol Program focuses on educating the public about auto crime actiity, as well as acting as a crime deterrent during rides through local neighbourhoods. Volunteers undergo extensive training, which enables them to act as community representatives of the City and Police, reporting all suspicious, criminal and nuisance behaviour they observe. The volunteers' close contact with the public and their dedication helps to alleviate the fear of crime in New Westminster.





Graffiti Eradication

Graffiti is a crime that can damage the economy, reputation and quality of life in a community. Volunteers assist by providing resources and education on the problem, encouraging citizens to remove graffiti, and report offences to the police.

Stolen Auto Recovery

Volunteers work with a partner, patrolling in a vehicle, in an effort to combat auto crime. Using the latest technology, information can be accessed on stolen vehicles. Once a match is found the police are alerted.
